

Arrow ECS History

- 1935** Arrow begins as a retail electronics store on New York City's Radio Row
- 1961** Arrow goes public, consisting of two retail stores and an electronics distribution business
- 1979** The first listing of Arrow's common stock is on the New York Stock Exchange, traded under symbol ARW
- 1994** Arrow acquires Gates/FA Distributing and Anthem Electronics, forming Gates/Arrow Electronics (now Arrow ECS)
- 1997** Arrow acquires Consan Inc. (now part of the North American Storage Group) and Support Net Inc. (now the North American IBM Group)
- 1998** Arrow acquires SBM Inc. (now the North American HP Group)
- 1999** Arrow's computer products groups are combined to form Arrow North American Computer Products Group (NACP)
- 2000** Arrow NACP acquires MOCA (now the North American MOCA/Sun Group); moves NACP corporate offices from Greenville, S.C., to Englewood, Colo.
- 2005** Arrow NACP acquires DNS.int AG in Europe, expanding its operations beyond North America; Arrow NACP rebranded as Arrow Enterprise Computing Solutions (ECS)
- 2006** Arrow ECS acquires SKYDATA in Canada; Alternative Technology in Englewood, Colo.; and InTechnology's Specialist Distribution Division in the United Kingdom
- 2007** Arrow ECS acquires the Agilysys Keylink Systems Group and Centia/AKS; establishes Mid-Market Group to serve medium-sized businesses through resellers
- 2008** Arrow ECS acquires LOGIX S.A., strengthening its presence in Europe and establishing a presence in the Middle East and Africa.
